#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### Dear Members,

I am pleased to present the President's Report for the St Peters Football Club for season 2024 at our Annual General Meeting. It has been another great year for our club, and I would like to thank the committee for all their time and dedication to St Peters Football Club and particularly their support of me in my first year as President. I would also like to share with you our achievements, as well as some of our challenges and future direction.

#### Overview

Our club has continued to grow in season 2024 thanks to the dedication and hard work of our members, committee, team officials, volunteers and players.

#### **Membership & Participation**

Our aim is to ensure that as many kids as possible can play footy in our East Bentleigh and Oakleigh south communities. This child-centric focus allows kids to have a safe space at our club where they can make friends, develop their footy skills, while improving their well-being both physically and mentally. As they develop these skills, they also have opportunities to develop with the support of the club through coaching and umpiring.

This season, Caroline Jones <sup>LM</sup> helped manage the registration of 415 registered players as well as season permits for our merged teams. This was a 9% increase on total registrations compared to season 2023 (see Table 1 below). Although girls' registrations continued to increase from 19% in



2022, 26% in 2023 to 33% in 2024, the slight decrease in boys' participation is a concern and will be a focus for the committee in season 2025.

This is especially important as competition from soccer, basketball and other life options is expected to only intensify next season and beyond.

It was with great sadness that we said farewell two life members in 2024, Kevin Logan and John Beveridge. Both Kevin and John worked tirelessly for St Peters and helped to shape it into the welcoming, inclusive, and thriving club that it is today. Vale to these stalwarts of our club.

#### Competition

St Peters Football Club entered 20 teams in the SMJFL competition for season 2025. This included 10 mixed teams (although very few girls played in the mixed teams), 4 boys-only teams and 6 girls-only teams.

Our Under 15 boys' teams once again merged with the Murrumbeena Football Club, allowing grading to occur and boys to play in divisions that suited their range of abilities. Our Under 18 girls team continued in their merge with Bentleigh Junior Football Club.

Of our 14 non-modified competitive teams, 10 played finals and 6 played grand finals, with 4 teams winning premierships. Congratulations to our premiership teams: U12 Mixed DIV 5 Logan, U13 Mixed DIV 3 Richardson, U15 DIV 3 McKinstry and U16 DIV 5 D'Zilva.

For a small number of teams, grading presented challenges this season, with a couple of teams struggling to win a game playing in divisions that were too high for them. Other teams played in divisions that did not present a challenge for them.

Although the SMJFL have worked on improving fixtures, divisions containing an uneven number of teams saw some teams have three byes this season. We will continue to advocate further with the SMJFL to ensure we don't face similar grading and fixturing issues in season 2025.



As Secretary, Narelle Warren has tirelessly advocated for our players, teams, parents and volunteers on the club's behalf and has given me such great support along the way.

It is our intention to increase our registration fees for season 2025 to maintain the high level of service we offer our members.

### TREASURER'S REPORT

St Peters Football Club entered 2024 in a very healthy position. The Club had 415 registered players, up 34 on the previous year. These registrations generated \$63.9K in revenue for the Club (2023: \$50.2K), which is the major source of Club income and supports training, match day, team and club building activities.

Sponsorship is another very important source of funding to support the Club operations, and the Sponsorship team were able to leverage the strong partnership St Peters has with the community in raising \$23K (2023: \$22K). The merchandise team generated \$26K in revenue (2023: \$12K) in selling our new hoodies, tees, shorts etc so that our players are always ready to hit the ground on game day. The Club also generated income from the Canteen, from raffles, as well as through the highly successful and well-attended Casino night.

The Club spends a significant amount of funds on the football program, including paying for Umpires, training kits, match day kits, club bags, club training tops, first aid training, a game day medic presence, line marking, cleaning, trophies to name a few! The Club did incur a small operating loss for the year, which was driven in the main by increased costs of game day medics, increased number of non-modified rules teams with paid umpires and the purchase of a merged game day jumper for our St Peters / Murrumbeena U15 teams. The Club finished the year with \$164K in the bank, which provides a healthy buffer for the future.

The 2024 Financial Statements have been prepared by the Club and audited independently. These are available to all Club Members on the Club website.

This year, Mandy O'Connor received the award for her tireless commitment to the Club. Bill Rodriquez (November 1924- March 2015) was the first Life Member of St Peters Football Club, and played an active role in our Club from its establishment in 1957 (as St Peters Boys Club) until the mid-1970s. Not only did Bill serve on the first committee, but he was Club President in 1959, 1964, 1970, and 1971. He was also Secretary from 1960-1962, then again in 1965 and 1966, and Treasurer between 1965 and 1966, and again in 1973, 1975, and 1976. Bill also coached and was team manager throughout this period.
